Then the song ended. And



Roni, one of Coquille Foursquare's own worship team members, has been playing the flute since she was nine years old. She also played in the South East Symphony in Alaska for five years.

- ► George Washington, James Madison, and Leonardo da Vinci all played the flute.
- ► The Prussian King, Frederick the Great, composed music (121 flute sonatas) and played it in his court by himself. He even commissioned Joann Sebastian Bach to write his solos for him so he could play them.

S FLUTE FACTS

- ► The oldest of all musical instruments. The very first flutes were originally made from bone, jade, stone, wood, or clay.
- ► You can consider almost anything as a flute. The classification of the flute is so simple, that literally any hollow tube you blow air into to produce sound is a flute. Bottle of Coke? Flute. A PVC pipe? Flute. An empty Pringles can? Also, a flute.
- ► There is one flute which can play a note so low, you can barely hear it. This is called the hyper bass flute, which is the biggest in the family. It's 26 feet long and can play a C note lower than a piano's

lowest C note. It's so low, that you can barely hear it. This is because the note is out of range of normal human hearing capacity. I think an elephant could hear it.

► You can actually play the flute in a lot of different genres, including jazz and even rock music! If you have a certain level of mastery in the instrument, you can play the flute in most modern contemporary pieces without a PLAYER problem. ■

TRUST & OBEY


A TESTIMONY KEN MAYNARD


