



the Lord to fill my life for His purposes. He did! This experience brought about a renewed awareness of Him, and it grew and grew in my journey throughout my life.





What does it mean to be powerless in recovery? It means that in and of myself, I don't have the self-control, or discipline to stop myself from carrying out my addictive behaviors. Romans 7:19 says, "For what I do is not the good I want to do. No, the evil I do not want to do, this I keep on doing."


My background includes every kind of abuse you can imagine during my grade school years. Those years were interrupted by a two-year stint with my strictly religious grandparents. They provided the most

After that, more abuse and dysfunction, followed by being placed in multiple foster care homes. I was bounced from house to house because I was drinking, using drugs, stealing, and being promiscuous. My foster parents were illequipped or unwilling to deal with my acting out and the pain of my past.

By the age of 24, I ended up in Alcoholics Anonymous. Romans 13:13 says, "And do not get drunk on wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit. Let us walk properly in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not is sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling or jealousy." In AA I began a life-

long struggle to "fix myself." When that didn't work, I figured I was too far gone. By this time, I disdained my grandparents' religion. But in AA I did learn about prayer, the Lord's prayer, the Serenity prayer and others. I worked the Twelve Steps after a fashion. but learned I was still powerless over alcohol, and powerless to restore myself to sanity. There was so much that I was afraid of. I was even afraid to go to the grocery store. My marriage, my friendships, being a parent, my work, basically every area of my life was consumed with fear.

So, now what? There I was, sober, 24, no Jesus, no examples to follow, no faith,

very little trust or knowledge about how to live my everyday life. I stumbled along for what took me ummm, only about 35 years! Once again, living life my way led to ruin, until my journey brought me to Jesus.

Seeds about Jesus had been planted by my grandparents, but I have few memories of childhood due to the extreme trauma I experienced. Finally, people came into my life preaching the gospel in a way I could hear. Pastor Jose gave such good advice, my Christian counselors helped immensely and women in a bible study loved me and accepted me right where I was. These people loved me while I was still a sinner. Now I rejoice in Romans 5:1-5. "Therefore since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus



Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings knowing that suffering produces endurance, endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." God didn't let my suffering or the consequences of my sin to go to waste.

The other day a friend at church asked me to tell her how my life was different after becoming a Christian. She had been a Christian all her life. I told her that now I feel plugged in to God and His power. God is healing my broken past. Zephaniah 3:17 says, "The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing." I am no longer powerless because He is my truth, my direction and my healing. He has forgiven the sins of my past. He has set me free.
